

Safety & Security

Your safety and the security of your personal property are of the utmost concern to us who welcome you as our guest.

We urge you to take advantage of the following suggestions.

Double Locks And Chains: For additional security, while in your room, utilize the deadbolt lock provided on your door upon entering. This will prevent the door from being opened by a regular room key. As an additional precaution, please secure the safety chain or bar lock.

Admittance: Do not admit persons to your room without first making identification. A peephole is provided in your door for your convenience. If there is any doubt about a person's true identity, please contact the front desk.

Keys: Safeguard your key. Be sure to leave it with the desk clerk upon departure. Do not leave it in your room or in the door. Do not give your key to others.

Automobiles: Ensure that your car is locked, and do not leave any items of value visible.

We hope that these procedures will contribute to your comfort and well-being during your stay.

Fire Safety

Hotels are doing even more to make sure that guests are safe from fire. Ask at the front desk if they have smoke detectors or automatic sprinklers. Take time to read and familiarize yourself with fire safety and escape information.

Find the two exits nearest to your room. Count the number of doors from your room to the exits. Make sure that they are unlocked and unblocked.

Learn the layout of your room and how to unlock the door in the dark. Put your room key and a flashlight close to where you sleep. In the event of fire, take your room key, flashlight and nothing else with you.

Locate the fire alarm on your floor. If you find a fire in your room or somewhere else, sound the alarm.

When you hear the fire alarm, act, don't investigate. Put these tips to work right away.

If the fire is in your room, get out and close the door. Once out, report the fire to the front desk.

If the fire is not in your room, leave if you can. First, feel the door. If it's cool, open it slowly, and go to the nearest exit.

If your room door is hot, don't open it. Your room may be the safest place to be. Call the front desk and report the fire and your location. Seal all cracks with wet towels. Shut off fans and air conditioners. Signal at your window or balcony for help, and wait to be rescued.

Crawl low in smoke. Fresh air will be at the floor. If you encounter smoke or fire at lower levels, turn around, and use another exit. Take your key so that you can go back to your room if you can't use your exits.

Never use elevators during a fire. They could stop at the fire floor. Use the interior stairs.

Carbon Monoxide Safety Tips



WARNING

Carbon Monoxide is a colorless, odorless, poisonous gas, and exposure can be fatal. Your room is equipped with a carbon monoxide detector.

Symptoms of carbon monoxide exposure may include:

Headache Vomiting

Fatigue Blurred vision

Weakness Dizziness

Nausea Loss of muscle coordination

Shortness of breath Collapse

Confusion Loss of consciousness¹

What to do if a carbon monoxide alarm is sounding or if you experience any symptoms of carbon monoxide exposure:

- Never ignore a carbon monoxide alarm that is sounding.
- Immediately move outside to fresh air.
- Advise the hotel front desk.
- Call 911, emergency services, or the fire department.
- Do a head count to check that all people in your party are accounted for.
- Do not reenter the premises until the emergency services responders have given you permission.²

High Speed Internet

Wired Steps:

If you're trying to connect to the Internet with a wire, please follow the steps below:

Step 1: Turn your computer on, if it isn't already turned on.

Step 2: Plug your CAT5 wire into the back of your computer, and then the other

end into the wall jack labeled CAT5. Note: If you need a CAT5 wire, please see the front desk. A phone cord will not work on the high speed network. If you're trying to connect to the network wirelessly, please refer to the

wireless section.

Step 3: Configure your computer's networking setting to "obtain an IP

address automatically."

Step 4: Once all of your settings are in place, double-click on your preferred

Internet browser. If your computer still doesn't connect, skip to

troubleshooting. If you can successfully access a web page, you are now

able to browse the Internet. Password is on the key card envelope.

Troubleshooting: Try releasing and renewing your IP address:

If you're using Windows: click on "start - run" and type the word

"cmd" and then click on "ok." At the command prompt, type in the words "ipconfig/release" and hit the "enter" key, then type the words "ipconfig/

renew" and then hit the "enter" key.

Note: If you're still having problems connecting, please dial 0 and the front desk

will help you!



PHILADELPHIA




Philadelphia is the largest city in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in the United States. With a population of 1,603,797 as of 2020, it is the sixth-most-populous city in the United States, the most populous city in the state of Pennsylvania, and the second-most populous city on the East Coast.



Philadelphia is one of the oldest municipalities in the United States and played a central role in the country's founding. William Penn, an English Quaker, founded the city in 1682 to serve as capital of the Pennsylvania Colony. During the American Revolution, Philadelphia also served as a meeting place for the Founding Fathers, who signed the Declaration of Independence in 1776 at the Second Continental Congress, and the Constitution at the Philadelphia Convention of 1787. Philadelphia remained the nation's largest city until 1790, when it was surpassed by New York City. It served as the nation's first capital and as the nation's capital during the American Revolution. After the Revolution, from 1790 to 1800, it again served as the U.S. capital while Washington, D.C. was under construction.

Philadelphia is the home of many U.S. firsts, including the nation's first library (1731 - the Library Company of Philadelphia), hospital (1751 - Pennsylvania Hospital), medical school (1765 - Perelman School of Medicine), national capital (1774 - the First Continental Congress), zoo (1874 - the Philadelphia Zoo), and business school (1881 - Wharton School). Philadelphia contains 67 National Historic Landmarks and the World Heritage Site of Independence Hall.





Because of its location in South Jersey, hugging the Atlantic Ocean between marsh and islands, Atlantic City was viewed by developers as prime real estate and a potential resort town. In 1853 the first commercial hotel was built. The city was incorporated in 1854, the same year train service began on the Camden and Atlantic Railroad. By 1874, almost 500,000 passengers a year were coming to Atlantic City by rail.

The first boardwalk was built in 1870 along a portion of the beach in an effort to help hotel owners keep sand out of their lobbies. Businesses were restricted and the boardwalk was removed each year at the end of the peak season. Because of its effectiveness and popularity, the boardwalk was expanded in length and width, and modified several times in subsequent years. The historic length of the boardwalk, before the destructive 1944 Great Atlantic Hurricane, was about 7 mi (11 km) and it extended from Atlantic City to Longport, through Ventnor and Margate.



Atlantic City has become known over the years for its portrayal in the board game Monopoly.

Marvin Gardens, the leading yellow property on the board, is actually a misspelling of the original location name, "Marven Gardens". It was not until 1995 that Parker Brothers actually acknowledged this mistake and apologized to the residents of Marven Gardens, although the spelling error was not corrected.

Some of the actual locations that correspond to board elements have changed since the game's release. Illinois Avenue was renamed Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. and St. Charles Place no longer exists, as the Showboat Casino Hotel was developed where it once ran.



By 1878, because of the growing popularity of the city, one railroad line could no longer keep up with demand. At this point massive hotels like The United States and Surf House, as well as smaller rooming houses, had sprung up all over town.

Gambling in Atlantic City traces back to prohibition and the 1920s, with racketeer Louis Kuehnle running an underground hotel and casino. Enoch "Nucky" Johnson followed and furthered Atlantic City's rise through the Roaring Twenties as a destination for drinking, gambling, and nightlife. In 1976, New Jersey legalized casinos, but restricted them to Atlantic City.
